Scam Reports

The Sheriff's Office started to track scams several months ago because they are so common. Here are scams or scam attempts from the past month:

Home Repair Scam—The victim wrote a check for \$3,300 to a male to complete remodel work on the bathroom and deck. She called today because she has been unable to get ahold of the male. The victim began doing online research of the contractor and found many Yelp reviews of him taking customer's money and never completing the agreed upon work.

Fake Jewelry Scam—The victim was putting fuel in his vehicle when a male at a different pump asked him if he would like to by some jewelry. He said he, his wife, and kids were down on their luck and he needed some money for gas and food. He said he felt bad for the family and gave the male \$500 for a Rolex watch and some other jewelry. When he went to sell the items he was advised they were fake.

Xcel Energy Scam—The caller reported receiving a phone call from a male named James saying he was from Xcel energy. The male reported he was going to shut their power off unless they gave them \$100 with their debt card. She did not give any money and are not out anything.

Student Loan Email Scam—"(Reporting Party's Name), Hello this is Quinn Cleur on behalf of the Student-Loan Debt Department. We tried to contact you at your home and did not hear back. Your Student-Loans have been marked as eligible for forgiveness under the new 2023 guidelines. Your case number is #82947, and your file will remain open in my system for only one more day. If you could please give your dedicated eligibility line a call at: 888-728-2074, we can have this applied immediately. Our office hours are 11am-7pm (EST) Monday-Friday. Thank You, Quinn Cleur"

TIP: The federal government will never contact you via phone or email, only via US Post Office mail.

Oak Wilt Inspections to Start Soon

Remember, we are still in our "no-cut" period for oak trees, effective through July 15th. If you need to cut a tree before then, you must first get a permit.

Ham Lake Tree Inspectors will do drive-by inspections from public roads looking for signs of oak wilt starting August 1st.

Tree Inspectors will note addresses where trees with visible evidence of oak wilt are located and will send notices via U.S. Mail to property owners. Inspectors will offer to do closer inspections of the trees on the property with the property owner's permission.

Fire Department Calls

The Ham Lake Fire Department responded to 35 calls during the month of May: 20 during the day and 15 at night. The department spent just over 65 hours on calls with a total personal time adding up to 484 hours.

Year-to-date, the department has answered 162 calls compared with 162 calls at the same time last year.

May Building Permits

The City of Ham Lake issued 139 permits in May with a valuation of \$1,748,793.00.

The issued permits are as follows: three commercial remodel, two commercial signs, one temporary tent, one commercial miscellaneous, four residential new construction, three residential basement finish, four residential accessory buildings, ten residential deck, one residential demolition, one residential miscellaneous, one residential pool, one residential solar panel, one residential window and 30 roofing/siding.

Other permits include 43 mechanical, 22 plumbing and 11 septic installations.

Lawn Watering Tips in Droughty Times

Did you know that lawn and garden watering accounts for an average of 40% of total household water usage during the summer?

During drought conditions this is a problem because our drinking water is not getting replenished by rain and:

- Multiple, short waterings can damage turf roots, and help weed growth instead .
- Watering can create runoff from leaky or malfunctioning sprinkler heads and carry pollutants like
 grass clippings and excess fertilizer into ponds and
 our ditch system. The excess phosphorous can
 cause algal blooms which can be smelly and also
 harm aquatic life.



Lawn Care Tips

- If you are watering, water your lawn deeply once per week to equal 1-inch total of rain and watering.
- When you water, make it count by watering before 10:00 am when it's cooler and the winds tend to be calmer. This allows water to soak into the soil and be absorbed by the grass roots before evaporating.
- Check your irrigation system for leaks and misdirected heads. The UMN Extension has two fact sheets to help. You'll find them here: extension.umn.edu/soil-and-water/irrigation
- Make sure your downspouts water your yard and gardens and not your driveway, patio or sidewalk.
- Use fine fescue grass seed for sunny areas. It needs less water.

Please use less drinking water on your lawn!

Did you know? If you're 55 years or older, state law requires your insurance company to give you a 10% discount after taking an 8-hour Defensive Driving Course and attending a 4-hour refresher course every three years.

Keep Sharps Out

Keep "sharps" out of your curbside recycling carts!

Sharps are syringes, lancets, used epipens, hypodermic pens or IV needles. Sharps should be taken to special drop-offs that dispose of them properly.

Why do sharps need to be managed separately? Injury and disease transmission occur when sharps are not managed properly.

Prevent injuries and disease transmission by disposing of these items safely. Recycling sorting facilities are not built to process sharps and workers can be injured by them. That is why many facilities throw away any black plastic bags of materials. No one wants a needle stick.

Proper Disposal

Used sharps may be stored in a puncture resistant container such as an empty laundry detergent bottle. Free disposal is available at the Anoka County Household Hazardous Waste Facility.

Additional collection programs may exist at clinics and hospitals or through mail-back programs.

- Automotive Products (antifreeze, gasoline, used motor oil and used oil filters)
- Fluorescent Bulbs (including HID and CFL's)
- Household Batteries (alkaline, lithium ion, cell phone, power tool, button and rechargeable batteries)
- Lead tackle
- Sharps (syringes, lancets, used EpiPens®, hypodermic needles, pen needles and IV needles)
 Sharps must be placed in a rigid, punctureresistant plastic container.

Ham Lake Business Spotlight: North Metro Storage

If you travel Highway 65 at all going to and from Ham Lake, you've seen the campus of North Metro Storage on the east side of the highway just south of 143rd Avenue.

When asked how long people typically store their things there, she said, "Everybody intends to be short-term, but tenants typically rent for about six months. People will clean out their house before they move, then want to get settled after the move before getting their things out of storage."

Most tenants choose month-to-month rentals, with no deposit required. 6-month and 12-month leases are options, too, if you know you'll need a unit that long. You'll get a bit of a price break.

North Metro Storage also offers secure outdoor parking for those who want to store a vehicle, boat or RV. The property is fully fenced with recorded surveillance cameras going 24/7.

boxes right on the cement. The temperature will change and the humidity settles on the cold cement. If you put cardboard right on it, it'll get musty. We recommend using a pallet, blocks of wood or even just a sheet of plastic under them."
