
Public Notice: Thin Ice at Ham Lake's Aeration Site

Ham Lake's Winter Parking Rules

Remember from October 1 through April 30, NO PARKING is allowed on Ham Lake streets between the hours of midnight and 6:00 am.

In addition, no parking is allowed in the daytime hours during or after a two-inch snowstorm or until the streets are plowed afterwards.

Tree Trimming in the City's **Right-of-Way**

Boulevard trees are trees that are located in the City's Right-of-Way.

Tree trimming maintenance is generally done in the fall, winter or spring as weather permits. The primary objective is to remove low hanging or broken branches and sightline obstructions that either are or could be a problem in the future.

Tree removal is generally assigned through the Public Works Department.

Used Batteries and Small Electronics

In recent years there has been a spike in fires erupting at recycling facilities due to lithium-ion batteries. These are the types of batteries contained in cell phones and other electronics, or rechargeable batteries.

In fact, recent research shows that nearly 40% of waste and recycling facilities have had fires every year due to unsuccessful attempts to recycle batteries and small electronics in curbside recycling.

In addition to fires breaking out at recycling facilities, waste and recycling collection trucks have also gone up in flames from lithium-ion batteries.

It goes without saying that these fires are an extreme safety hazard for both drivers and the people working in recycling facilities—as well as the surrounding communities.

Small electronics and most batteries don't belong in recycling or trash. Instead, take them to a safe collection site. Examples of collection sites for items with rechargeable batteries nearest Ham Lake are:

- Lowe's in Blaine (11651 Ulysses St NE)
- Home Depot in Blaine (4550 Pheasant Ridge Dr NE)
- Target in Andover (2000 Bunker Lake Blvd NW)
- Anoka County Household Hazardous Waste Facility in Blaine (3230 101st Ave NE)

Alkaline batteries can legally be placed in the garbage, according to Anoka County's Recycling Directory website page. But it's illegal to throw away a rechargeable battery, a rechargeable battery pack or a product with a non-removable rechargeable battery (Minn. Stat. §115A.9157).

Cellphones, laptops, car keys and e-cigarettes are all powered by batteries and need to be disposed of properly. Batteries that are punctured or damaged can cause explosions and fires and should never be placed in your trash or recycling bin.



Annual Tree Seedling Sale

Spring is just around the corner so get your tree order in today for the end of April pick up at the Anoka Conservation District.

The District offers a wide variety of native stock, including black cherry trees, mixed oak trees, maple trees, and pine trees.

The trees and shrubs are sold in bare root seedlings or transplants range from 12" to 18" in height. They may be purchased in bundles of 10 for \$23, or 25 for \$45 not including tax. Native prairie seed and tree aides are also available.



The City would like to remind residents of the approaching "no-cut" period for oak trees which starts April 1st and is effective through July 15th (Article 11.1400.4 of the City Code).

If you need to cut an oak tree or trees during the nocut period, you must get a permit from the City prior to cutting. Please contact a City tree inspector with any questions at 763-235-1662. Residential soil moisture sensors and smart irrigation controllers cost a couple hundred dollars and can be added to any irrigation system. Water savings for an average home is 15,000 gallons a year¹ or 20-40%². Save money on water, electricity and pump maintenance. Protects aquifers from drawdown.

Winter Salt Alternatives

Did You Know...

Clearing snow before it can get compacted into ice is safer and cheaper than throwing down salt to try to create bare pavement?

This one tip can provide safe areas for walking, is cheaper, and protects our waters.

Why protect our waters? Coon Creek, like the rest of the Metro, is getting increasingly polluted with chlorides, primarily from winter road salt. This is a pollutant that stays in the water, is very expensive (nearly impossible) to get out of the water, and is very harmful to fish and other aquatic life.

The cheapest and easiest way to deal with it is through prevention:

- Putting snow tires on your car, even just the two front tires (for front-wheel drive vehicles), will give you much better grip in most snow conditions.
- Remember to slow down! Since most road salt is used for highway safety, we can all help by adjusting our expectations from summer to winter road conditions.

The City has sent staff to specialized, low-cost certification trainings on how to efficiently remove snow and ice to save taxpayer money while providing a high level of service.

To find out what else you can do to have safe walkways and prevent chloride pollution of our waters, go to our website for home winter salting tips to save on winter salt and de-icers.

Remember, before you get out your winter de-icer, think about picking up your snow shovel instead!
