Let's Get Through Another Snowy Winter Together

It takes teamwork between Ham Lake residents and the City to successfully get us through another snowy winter.

The only thing certain about the weather this winter is that there will be snow, and some of it will fall on Ham Lake's roads and streets.



What the City Will Do

Here's what the City will do about the snow to help you get through it as painlessly as possible:

Streets will be plowed if two or more inches of snow fall. Plowing will begin as soon as feasible after the snowfall stops. During long storms, main routes will be plowed and sanded as soon as the accumulation becomes hazardous for driving.

Every effort will be made to have main routes plowed and sanded before morning or afternoon rush hour. For an average snowfall of three to six inches, the City's goal is to complete all plowing within eight to twelve hours. (Major blizzards take more time.)

What You Can Do

Here's what you can do to help all of us get through it as painlessly as possible:

You can help protect your sod by marking the curb line with wooden laths (not metal stakes) until after the first couple of snowfalls.

Avoid any other type of planting or construction in the snow storage area of the City's right-of-way (which extends 20 feet back from the street).

Don't park or store vehicles or boats in that area either. (You don't want them covered with heavy piles of snow from the street, do you?)

Remember that it's your responsibility to clean your driveway, areas for trash cans (which can't be in the street) and areas around mailboxes and newspaper tubes.

Keep in mind that you'll have to do this without dumping any of your snow in the street, and without leaving large piles that obstruct vision around your driveway.

Finally, remember not to park your car on the street during a snowfall or overnight during the winter.

Winter Parking Rules

Ham Lake's Winter Parking Rules say that from October 1st through April 30th no parking is allowed on Ham Lake streets between the hours of midnight and 6:00 am. In addition, no parking is allowed in the daytime hours during or after a two-inch snow-storm or until the streets are plowed.

Thanksgiving Safety Tips

For most, the kitchen is the heart of the home, especially during the holidays. From testing family recipes to decorating cakes and cookies, everyone enjoys being part of the preparations. So keeping fire safety in mind in the kitchen during this joyous and hectic time is important.

- Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires, followed by the day before Thanksgiving, Christmas Day and Christmas Eve.
- In 2018 U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 1,630 home cooking fires on Thanksgiving.
- Unattended cooking was by far the leading contributing factor in cooking fires and fire deaths.
- Cooking equipment was involved in almost half of all reported home fires and home fire injuries. It is the second leading cause of home fire deaths. The NFPA (National Fire Protection Assoc.) discourages the use of outdoor gas-fueled turkey fryers.

Safety tips

- Stay in the kitchen when you cook.
- Stay in the home when you cook your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children three feet away from the stove.
- Make sure kids stay away from hot food and liquids. They can cause serious burns.
- Keep the floor clear so you don't trip over kids' toys, pocketbooks or bags.
- Keep knives out of the reach of children.
- Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of small child.
- Keep matches and utility lighters out of the reach of children—up high in a locked cabinet.
- Never leave children alone in room with a lit candle.
- Make sure your smoke alarms are working. Test them by pushing the test button.

Fall Clean-Up & Fire Safety

As the weather changes and the leaves begin to fall from trees, yearly clean-up begins.

For some residents this involves bagging their yard waste and putting it out on the curb or taking it to a collection site. For others, they decide to pile it up and set it on fire.

This year, with sparse rain, high winds and lack of humidity, the risk of fire danger has been elevated.

The Ham Lake City Code — Fire Department does not permit burning of any materials other than wood in an approved recreational fire ring or portable fire place. "Wood" is dry, clean fuel.



What May Be Burned?

- Twigs, branches and tree limbs
- Presto logs, charcoal and cord wood
- Untreated dimensional lumber
- Wood pallets cut down to fit recreational fire requirements

What MAY NOT Be Burned?

- Wood that is still green
- Wet or dry leaves or needles
- Rotten, wet or oil soaked wood
- Treated or painted wood
- Wood that has glue or preservatives
- Household trash or garbage
- Construction materials

4-Hour Refresher Course: You need to take this every three years. Time flies, so make sure you are current! The fee is \$22 for the 4-hour class.

8-Hour Refresher Course: Required for first timers. The fee is \$26 for the 8-hour class.

None are scheduled at this time.

Did you know? If you're 55 years or older, state law requires your insurance company to give you a 10% discount after taking an 8-hour Defensive Driving Course and attending a 4-hour refresher course every three years.

Ham Lake Metal Artist Creates Memorial for Local Family

When Ham Lake metal artist, Dave Estrada, heard the story of Katya Loahr Ukaegbu, he decided to create a sculpture to honor her death. Katya was just 18 when she was struck and killed by a distracted driver five years ago.

Katya's family and friends joined Dave at Mickman's Garden Center where her dad, Zeph, has worked for 15 years. Dave presented the family with his stainless steel sculpture of three giant flowers—eight, ten and twelve feet tall—as a memorial for Katya.

Dave and the Ukaegbu family hope the sculpture will serve as a reminder for motorists to say "no" to distracted driving, including texting. In 2018, the most recent year statistics are available from the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, 34 people were killed by distracted drivers. Minnesota's hands-free bill went into effect in August of 2019 in an effort to prevent these needless deaths.

Ham Lake's Hunting Regulations

3-200 Discharge of Firearms and Bows and Arrows

(1) Except as permitted in subsection (2) below, no person shall discharge a firearm upon, onto, or across any "Prohibited Areas" within the City of Ham Lake. No person shall discharge an arrow from a bow upon, onto, or across any Prohibited Area within the City of Ham Lake. "Prohibited Area" shall include the following:

- The outside perimeter of all platted subdivisions, including auditor's plats;
- The outside perimeter of all areas of residential concentration in which lots have been created by metes and bounds, and which have been identified by the Zoning Administrator as the equivalent of platted areas;
- All schools and churches, measured from the lot lines of the parcel upon which the school or church is situated;
- The outside perimeter of all City or County parks;
- The traveled portion of any public road.

(2) Notwithstanding the foregoing, firearms and bows and arrows may be discharged upon, onto or across Prohibited Areas described in Article 3-200(1)(a) and (b), under the following conditions:

- The person is the owner or lessor of, or has the written or verbal permission of the landowner who owns the land upon which the firearm or bow and arrow is discharged, the land upon which the projectile comes to rest, or the land over which the projectile passes; and
- The discharge of the firearm does not occur within 500 feet of any residential dwelling, unless the written or verbal permission referred to in item 2(a) above specifically permits discharge within 500 feet of the dwelling.

(3) In areas which are not Prohibited Areas, persons may discharge firearms or bows and arrows, but only under the same conditions as are listed in Article 3-200(2)(a) and (b).

(4) The provisions of paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this section do not apply to the discharge of firearm by law enforcement officers while performing their duties.

(5) The term "firearm" as used in this section includes pistols, rifles, revolvers, and shotguns.

(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections 1 through 6, inclusive, of Article 3-200, it shall be unlawful for any person to discharge a firearm for the purpose of target practice, including the terms clay pigeon shooting, skeet shooting, trap shooting, gun-sighting or other recreational shooting not

aimed at actual game, except under the following conditions:

- The activity is carried out on premises which have a conditional use permit for the activity; or
- The activity is carried out on premises and under conditions which meet the criteria outlined in Article 3-200 (2) of this Code, and
 - The activity is limited to no more than two sessions every seven days; and
 - The activity takes place between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., and
 - The activity introduces no lead shot onto any wetland which has been so designated by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

The discharge of firearms within any land area inside a Shore Impact Zone, or upon or over the surface of any water within the normal high-water mark of Ham Lake, Coon Lake, Lake Netta or Little Coon Lake is prohibited.

Ham Lake Representatives Needed

The City of Ham Lake is seeking citizens interested in being appointed as the City of Ham Lake's representative to the Sunrise River Watershed Management Organization and an alternate to the Upper Rum River Watershed Management Organization.

The Ham Lake representative to these organizations receives a \$30 per diem for each meeting. These organizations normally meet on a quarterly basis.

The general purpose of both these organizations is to develop and implement a Watershed Management Plan for the purpose of managing surface and groundwater within the respective Water Management Organizations.

Fire Department Calls

The Ham Lake Fire Department responded to 48 calls during the month of September: 26 during the day and 22 at night.

The department spent 17 hours on calls with total personal time adding up to 495 hours. Year-to-date, the department has answered 317 calls, compared with 364 calls at the same time last year.

September Building Permits

The City of Ham Lake issued 192 permits in September with a valuation of \$1,441,277.28. The issued permits are as follows: one commercial accessory building, two commercial demolition, one commercial fence, one commercial sign, four residential new construction, two residential remodel, one residential addition, three residential basement finish, four residential accessory building, three manufactured home, 10 residential deck, three residential miscellaneous, one residential pool, two residential window, and 98 roofing/siding.

Other permits include 32 mechanical, 9 plumbing and 15 septic installations.

Leaves! Leaves! Leaves!

"Leaf" it to nature to break down your leaves. Just mow them finely so your grass can use them as natural fertilizer and you can save time and money on fertilizing, raking and blowing.

If you keep leaf piles for the kids or grandkids to jump in, use the leaves afterwards as mulch for your flower beds. Or you can recycle them in other ways:

1. Check with your garbage hauler for proper leaf disposal. It's illegal to put yard waste in with your garbage.
2. Take the leaves to a county compost site. Get updates about drop-offs during COVID by calling 763-323-5730 or checking the County website: www.anokacounty.us/361/Brush-Tree-Yard-Waste

Out of the Street, Ponds and Creeks!

Reminder: Please keep all leaves out of the street. They can clog storm drains and add pollution to our waters. Street Sweepers are not out to collect your leaves! There is plenty of sand that needs to be vacuumed up from streets. Leaves lessen the capacity of the sweeper to collect the sand.

And, like grass clipping piles, please keep leaves out of creeks, ponds and ditches (even along the banks). Leaves can add excess phosphorus to our creeks, ponds and lakes which can lead to algal blooms that can be harmful to fish.
