Scams

11.25 The victim received a phone call from an unknown person claiming to be with Medicare Rewards. He began to ask several questions thinking this was a scam. He said the unknown male got upset and yelled "tomorrow you will die" before hanging up the phone. The victim did not have any further information but wanted the incident documented.

11.29 The victim advised that he received a message from a Brown Luna at phone number 1-843-597-9136, stating that he was part of Border Patrol. He advised that the message stated that agents from Border Patrol had items that had his information on it and that he needed to call the number to speak with them about the matter. The victim advised that he dialed the number but did not continue with any of the prompts and called authorities instead.

11.30 The victim advised she received a call from someone stating that they were from Minneapolis Police Department (MPD); a Sgt. Brian Cunningham with badge #81557. He told her she had a warrant out for her arrest for failure to report for Jury Duty. She advised that the notice was sent to her son's address in Minneapolis. Sgt. Cunningham said two citations have been issued in her name for a sum of \$2,000 dollars; one 221CV7143 was given for the failure to appear with a fine amount of \$1,000 and 221CV1113 was given for contempt of court. She advised that Sgt. Cunningham stated that she was supposed to appear in Judge Jamie Anderson's courtroom for Jury Duty. She was told that she needed to pay her fines in cash via Gift Cards. She advised that she was unable to obtain the full \$2,000 out of her bank due to it being closed, but she did have \$500. She purchased a Money Pay card and placed \$500 dollars onto it and then gave him the card number. She advised that Sgt. Cunningham is supposed to call her back today by noon to obtain the remainder of \$1,500 dollars still owed for her fines. I advised her not to give him any more money but to let him know that you have spoken with the real police. With some research, Judge Jamie Anderson is a real judge with the Fourth District Court. Sergeant Brian Cunningham is a real licensed peace officer and sergeant with either the Hennepin County Sherriff's Office or the Minneapolis Police.

11.27 14xx 155 Ave NW – a home was tp'd

Arrests

11.25 43xx 144 Lane NW – Warrant Arrest; deputies went to a home looking for a male with a warrant. They knocked and his mother answered the door. She stated they could search the home. The male was found in the back seat of a vehicle hiding. He was ordered out and arrested.

11.28 Round Lake/181 Ave NW – Criminal Vehicular Operation; deputies responded to a crash where one person rear-ended another. When they arrived, the woman who rear-ended the vehicle was

manic and uncooperative. Deputies looked in the vehicle and saw a meth pipe. When they told the woman they were going to search the vehicle, she fought with them. The male she hit had serious medical issues. A warrant for a blood draw was obtained and the woman was arrested. Drugs were also found in the vehicle.
